

## “Pentecost is Ordinary Time”

The Day of Pentecost brings to a close the Great Fifty Days and the Eastertide season. The Sundays following the Day of Pentecost are called Pentecost Sundays until the season of Advent. The time between Pentecost and Advent has traditionally been called “Ordinary Time” in our liturgical calendar. Now, the phrase “ordinary time” seems a bit anti-climactic after the anticipatory season of Advent leading up to Christmas and the Epiphany or the great season of Lent that prepares us for Easter or the on-going celebration of Easter throughout the Great Fifty Days and the Eastertide season.

For many of us living through the liturgical seasons of the Church and its many observances, activities, and programs, some of us may be secretly relieved by a seemingly more mundane sounding season that is simply called “Ordinary Time”. Sorry, faithful folks! The design and purpose of “Ordinary Time” is neither mundane or simple or very ordinary.

In fact, Ordinary Time is actually the climax of all the previous observances, liturgical seasons, Holy Days, and celebrations. Everything that we have experienced; everything that we have learned; everything that we have contemplated; every insight, nurturance, or inspiration that we have received from all the previous seasons are purposefully intended for the primary purpose of living out the Gospel and the love of God in Christ throughout our ordinary lives and in ordinary times, situations and circumstances.

Now this, dear ones, is neither mundane or simple. Living out the Gospel, our faith, and the love of God in our everyday lives is a daunting and challenging task ahead of us. It will take all of our experiences, knowledge, inspirations, nurturance, and fortified spirit taken from all the previous liturgical seasons to accomplish such a challenging and labor-intensive task. In fact, God knows that we will need his help to become faithful disciples in our ordinary and everyday life. This is why the Holy Spirit from Pentecost has been sent to us by God as our Great Counselor, our Great Physician, and our Great Comforter. God knows that we need help in being true disciples of Christ!

The Sunday after Pentecost is recognized as Trinity Sunday. The Church has strategically placed this Holy Day as a reminder that we have the comfort, affirmation, and anointing of the Holy Trinity from a Triune God that will enable us to accomplish more than we can do ourselves to become faithful disciples of Christ and witnesses of God’s love. I don’t know about you but I do a pretty good job at observing and benefiting from all those wonderful liturgical seasons from Advent through Pentecost but living out the Gospel and the true faith in my everyday life is the hard part. And yet...that is exactly what we are called to do! God calls each of us to be extraordinary disciples by showing his extraordinary love in our ordinary lives. May the power of the Holy Spirit from Pentecost and the Triune God of the Holy Trinity convict us, convert us, sustain us, and empower us to accomplish his purpose in our life.
