"Lent and the Baptismal Covenant"

Our recent Ash Wednesday services mark the beginning of the Lenten Season. During the Epiphany season, we experienced the mountain top themes of the promise of the Light of Christ to the whole world, the assurance of our membership in the Family of God through Baptism, and the comforting knowledge that we serve a powerful God that cares about us even in our mundane and everyday life. After receiving the assurance and comfort from the "Epiphany" that the Divine is with us, in us, and around us, we now go down the mountain to the places that we live our everyday lives.

Before we truly go into the world attempting to live and act between our humanity and the Divine, there is a base camp, "Camp Lent", to prepare us for the great celebration of Easter. It is in the celebration of Easter where we receive the blessing of being "Easter People" and are given our roadmaps and marching papers as we go out to live into the world with mission and purpose. Like Jesus before us who came down "the mountain" from his acclaimed Baptism and entered into the "wilderness of preparation", so do we enter into a Lenten journey of preparation.

In our present times, I fear that this historically spiritual time of preparation through self-evaluation, reflection, spiritual discipline, fasting, spiritual formation, meditation, prayer, self-denial, and repentance has been reduced to a church game of giving up gumdrops or filet mignon. The notion of giving up red meat but eating lobster is not the ascetic principle that gave Christians the nickname of "fish people". Times have changed where fresh and exotic fishes are now more of a luxury item than most meats. The point is that many Christians have lost the point.

I would suggest to make sure that we stay on track for the true meaning, purpose, and benefit of Lent that we start by looking at our Baptismal Covenant. The Baptismal Covenant is not only our "birth certificate" into the Kingdom of God but it is also our promise to God as a sacred covenant. The written document of our covenant is found in the Book of Common Prayer (p. 304). The first part of the Baptismal Covenant tells us what we believe and the second part of the Covenant tells us what we will do. Our Baptismal Covenant is a confession or promise that is co-signed with the very blood of Jesus.

Would it not be most prudent and beneficial to evaluate where we are and how we are doing with our birthright promises to God on a regular basis and especially during Lent? Admittedly, this will be more challenging than passing up a slice of chocolate pie. It would be far more beneficial in faithful discipleship to see where we may fall short in our promises to God and to reevaluate, plan, and act on increased awareness and needed changes during Lent.

Daughters of the King

What do the silver crosses worn by some ladies of St. Philip mean? If it is a modified Greek Fleury cross, small or large, it is the emblem of The Order of The Daughters of The King. It is inscribed with a Latin motto which translates into "with heart, mind and spirit uphold and bear the cross." FHS is engraved at the base of the cross, meaning "For His Sake"

The only way to obtain this cross is to join The Order. We wear it daily as a constant reminder of our yows. It is our "habit".

When a woman takes her vows her cross is blessed by the celebrant, and placed in her right hand as the celebrant administers her vows. The cross is the property of The Order. When a Daughter dies her cross may be buried with her or attached to a marker. Otherwise, it is returned to The Order by her family. It may not be bequeathed to anyone.

Wearing the cross daily provides opportunities for witness and evangelism. Whenever a Daughter gets a chance to answer questions about her cross, she is able to explain who Daughters are, what we do, and offer prayer and love. Many of us have had amazing conversations at the gas pump or in the grocery store!




