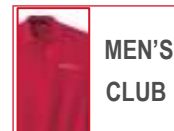
Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

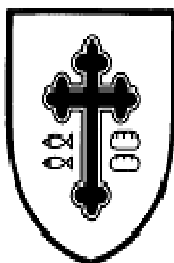

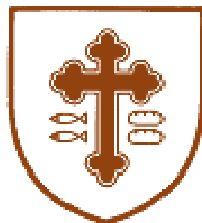

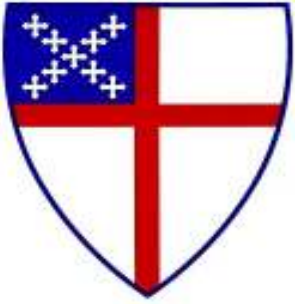
