
" Alleluia! Christ is Risen!"

After holding our "alleluias" thoughout the Lenten Season and Holy Week, we were able to say our first "Alleluia" at the Great Opening Acclamation during our Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday services:

"Alleluia! Christ is Risen!"
"He is risen, indeed, Alleluia!"

The Great Opening Acclamation will continue to be said at the beginning of each Eucharist Service from Easter eve through the Day of Pentecost. The Great Opening Acclamation proclaiming the Risen Lord not only releases us from the tension of withholding our "alleluias" but it also marks the ending of our Lenten Season.

This year's Parish Lenten Program focused on the special video and reflection series entitled "Love Letwing the Gospel of Love" sponsored by the Anglican order of the Society of St. John the Evangelist. The series offered our parishioners the opportunity to view and hear daily reflections based on the Gospel of John. Each Sunday morning during Adult Education, we would review, reflect, and discuss the weekly central messages that were important to us. Though all did not participate as hoped, those who did found it to be a meaningful, thought provoking, and comforting experience during Lent.

The Wednesday Evening Lenten Program included our annual fellowship meal followed by different reflective interpretations of the the "Stations of the Cross" each week. This program continues to be one of our most well attended and meaningful programs of the season. This year's Lenten season was brought to a close by the very moving and emotional Holy Week services that lead to the grand crescendo of our glorious Easter celebrations.

The liturgical season between Easter and the Day of Pentecost has traditionally been called "Eastertide" designating the "Great Fifty Days of Easter". Since the first few centuries of the Early Church, this has been a season of rejoicing, celebration, thanksgiving, and redemptive liturgies. During the "Great Fifty Days of Easter", there are some liturgical customs and observances that highlight the redemptive and celebratory nature of the Eastertide season. As a reminder, some of them are:

- ♦ The liturgical color is white used during the entire Fifty Days
- ♦ The Paschal candle is moved from its normal position near the baptismal font to a prominent place near the altar to remind us of our Baptismal Covenant in our celebrations
- The "Alleluia" which is omitted during Lent is restored to the liturgy as the premier expression of joy celebrating the Resurrection
- ♦ The "Gloria" which is omitted during Lent is also restored to the liturgy as a point of praise and celebration
- The Acclamation of: "Alleluia! Christ is Risen!" is said at the beginning of each worship service
- ♦ The Fraction Anthem is sung in place of the Agnus Dei.
- ♦ As Rite I is celebrated during the Lenten season, Rite II is observed during the Eastertide season
- ♦ Standing during the Eucharistic Prayer acknowledges that Christ has made us worthy to stand before Him.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd



(For children 2½ years-6th grade) Liturgy of Light-Sunday, May 11

Our biggest celebration of the year, the Liturgy of Light, will take place on Sunday, May 11 at 9 AM. This prayer celebration follows the liturgical structure of the Great Vigil of Easter and helps initiate the children in the rich Easter Liturgy of the Church. Following the blessing and lighting of our atrium Paschal candle, we will walk forward in darkness to follow its light. After brief readings and songs, the children will receive a candle lit from the Paschal candle, which symbolizes the Risen Christ. Sofia Cavalletti, one of the founders of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, says in her book, The Religious Potential of the Child, "The moment when we linger to look at the light that has come all the way to us is often a time of intense contemplation, leaving a vivid memory that the growing children cherish." We'll have chairs set up in the Parish Life Center for our atrium parents and any others in our parish family who would like to join us to observe the celebration. Hope to see you there!






